ACES Learning Center Course Syllabus E103: Introduction to English Writing and Literature

Course Objectives and Student Competencies:

- 1. Students will read challenging, above-grade-level passages, both fiction and non-fiction.
- 2. Students will master new grammatical structures by emulating writing (sentence-composing).

Class Structure:

Class will include reading passages, discussion of homework reading, and lecture on a new grammar topic each week. Students will have the opportunity to practice sentence-composing (composition) exercises during class. Readings will cover Lexile levels 650-950 (emphasizing 700-900).

Required Materials:

Students will bring pencil, paper, a folder, a notebook for sentence-composing, and completed homework to all classes.

Class Assignments:

Students will complete assigned readings and sentence-composing (writing) exercises. Students will also read two books, *The Brilliant World of Tom Gates* and *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*. (The choice of books will be adjusted if students have already read these two).
