Course Name: Creative Writing – Funny Tales for 4th-5th Graders

## **Course Description**

ACES Creative Writing – Funny Tales serves as an introduction to creative writing using the six traits<sup>1</sup> by exploring tall tales, trickster tales, and other humorous stories from around the world as a model for completing a written narrative. Students will engage in daily prompts and undertake various exercises to stimulate the imagination and hone writing skills. By the end of the course, student will complete a multi-page, polished, short story narrative.

## **Course Objectives and Student Competencies**

- · Gain confidence and skills as creative writers
- Learn the essential components of fictional narratives
- Become more fluent in use of grammatical constructions and vocabulary through writing and practice

## **Class Structure**

Class begins with a short discussion of an assigned reading. Each day we will go through one of the six "traits" and practice writing each piece.
